5. <u>Discussion and possible action, Regarding the District's Property, Liability, and Vehicle Insurance Coverage.</u>

Fire Chief Turner reported that NCCFD was notified on October 4th of a substantial increase to the district's property, liability, and vehicle insurance. NCCFD budgeted \$59,000 and the insurance increased to \$138,000 (approximately a 140% increase). Hillary Erickson, a representative with Atwood Insurance spoke and briefed the Board on increasing costs due to issues in the global market and with larger employee claims. Hillary also presented the quote that was the best fit for the district moving forward. Director Nelson motioned to accept the quote, budget for the increase and look at a revised budget at the next meeting to account for the payment. Director Carrington seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote.

6. <u>Discussion and possible action</u>, <u>Resolution R22-34</u>, <u>Approving the Job Description and Amending the District Staffing Roster to establish the following position per the NCCFD Personnel Code Section 1.3.1:</u>

Fire Prevention Assistant

Fire Marshal Mason stated this position falls into the reserve classification. This position opens up the ability to have personnel available for fire investigations, code enforcement, plan reviews and public education as needed. Director Nelson motioned to adopt Resolution R22-34, Approving the job description, and amending the District Staffing Roster to establish the position per the NCCFD Personnel Code 1.3.1. Director Carrington seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote.

7. Correspondence:

A. Thank you card from The Daughters of the American Revolution left at Station 88.

CHIEF'S MONTHLY REPORT

Division Chief Sullivan verbally reviewed his report highlighting that there were 257 calls for service, which included 3 structure fires, 2 vehicle fires and 6 vegetation fires. All out-of-county resources have returned.

Administration attended several meetings this past month including the Nevada County Fire Chiefs Meeting, Yuba River Cohorts Meeting, Nevada County Law Enforcement Fire Council, Nevada Union HS Safety Summit, KNCO Talk of the Town, as well as meeting with Penn Valley FD and Grass Valley Fire regarding Rough & Ready Fire regarding their new response policy.

Fleet & Facilities Supervisor Greene advised that the siding project at Station 86 is near completion. He reported that he will be meeting with architects for the project and will bring his findings to the next board meeting in November.

Fire Marshal Mason reported Station 89 attended Alta Sierra Elementary's Jog-A-Thon (350 students) and Station 84 visited Nini's Preschool (12 children).

Fire Marshal Mason also reported he investigated a fire within a travel trailer parked at a residence. The cause was determined to be RC car batteries charging. He assisted Acting Captain Chris Johnsen with a fire investigation involving solar panels on a residential roof.

Honorable Governor Gavin Newsom, Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara, Senator Brian Dahle, and Assemblymember Megan Dahle,

On behalf of the Nevada County Consolidated Fire District, I am writing you regarding an urgent matter associated with the availability and affordability of commercial insurance for our local fire authorities and volunteer fire brigades. Recently, we have become aware that our local fire special districts and volunteer fire departments were notified either of a loss of commercial insurance coverage and/or forced to accept large increases in their commercial coverage otherwise set to expire on November 1, 2022. As a small rural county, we depend on fire services provided by ten special districts, two incorporated city departments, and volunteer brigades, outside of CAL FIRE.

Our insurance premium increased 144% from 2021 to 2022 at Nevada County Consolidated Fire District. As you very well know, fire response is a critical public safety service. This situation, coupled with the increasing costs of fuel, places our public safety services in at serious risk- all during the height of fire season- which means that our residents are in direct jeopardy. It is simply unacceptable to allow our fire departments to close when we have never needed them more.

We are not ignorant on the complexities of insurance and the exorbitant amount of risk carriers face from catastrophic wildfires today. But we need state action, whether executive, regulatory, legislatively or all three to ensure fire authorities, special districts and volunteer fire brigades are protected from market-driven and inflationary costs that place public safety activities at risk. This is not a local problem; it's a California problem and we need action and your support to protect Californians today. Therefore, we urge you to work directly with us, the insurance carriers and local fire associations to take action in addressing this matter to ensure our community has firefighters and the resources needed to keep our communities safe.
